Teachers, Families, and Students—Working Together to Achieve Success

The teachers, parents/family members, and students of J.C. Magill , worked jointly to develop the School-Family Compact.

All families are invited to be involved in the joint development and revision of the School-Family Compact. The Compact is written and reviewed annually with input and feedback from families, teachers, community business partners and other stakeholders at the Title I Planning Meeting and document review opportunities. At J.C. Magill, we will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Provide parents with fun reading and math games, activities
 and learning materials that focus on sight words and reading
 comprehension as well as basic math fact fluency and math
 problem solving. The resources are available to check out for
 use in the home through our Parent Center.
- Offer family friendly Literacy and STEAM (Science, Technology, Arts, & Math) Nights where parents can learn games and activities to support fluent recognition of sight words, reading comprehension strategies, basic math fact fluency, and problem solving.
- Offer parents workshops where the Parent Instructional Coordinator in collaboration with Math and Literacy coaches will model practices on how to specifically work with students on math problem solving and reading strategies for comprehension at home.
- Provide a school eClass pages with family friendly links to fun

websites for building sight word knowledge, reading comprehension, math facts practice, and math problem solving skills so that parents can support their child's learning at home.

As students of J.C. Magill, we will join staff and parents to develop ideas about how we can succeed in school and reach success in math and reading. The following ideas are to help make connections between learning at home and school:

- Explore with my family on the school eClass pages and fun websites to practice my reading and math skills each week.
- Bring home my Friday Folder and notices about parent workshops, Literacy and STEAM Nights. Ask my family to attend and play the games that we learn to make reading and math fun.
- Keep a weekly log of the games and activities that I play at home with my family to practice reading and math.
- Read nightly to practice my sight words and reading comprehension.
- Practice my math facts and problem solving with my family each day.

As Families, we will join the staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Have fun with reading and math with my child by using materials checked out from the Parent Center to explore math and reading at home.
- Attend Literacy and STEAM Nights with my child, as well as parent workshops to learn reading comprehension and math problem solving strategies as well as how to develop constructed responses. Get information from the Parent Center or my child's teacher if we can't attend.
- Look for the class newsletter each Friday in the Friday
 Folder and check out the school eClass pages. Encourage my child to play games on the recommended educational websites weekly to reinforce their reading comprehension and math problem solving skills.
